


Cambodia - bordered by Laos, Vietnam and Thailand - is a country of great contrasts. During the height of the Angkorian era, the Khmer Empire ruled over most of the Southeast-Asian subcontinent. This time also brought forth Angkor Wat - one of the wonders of the world and the most famous landmark of Cambodia.

However, the country's former glory is overshadowed by recent history: 1975 Khmer Rouge won the Civil War and began to restructure the state politically and socially. Cambodia still hasn't recovered completely from this cruel communist experiment. All the more the friendliness and warm-heartedness of the mainly Buddhist population is touching. Discover Cambodia: its pristine rain forests, sunny beaches, bustling capital, great variety of food and especially its unique and **rich legacy of the Khmer Empire**.

Day 1: Shanghai - Phnom Penh

Evening flight Shanghai (Pudong) - Phnom Penh Meet & Greet at Airport Private transfer to your hotel, check-in Night at centrally located (***/ ****) Hotel, Phnom Penh



Day 2: Highlights of Phnom Penh

Breakfast

With your private guided tour you will explore the highlights of Cambodias capital. **Wat Phnom** - where the Khmers pray for luck - offers great views over the city.

Constructed in 1866 the **Royal Palace** today still serves as the king's residence - and is a mighty symbol of his kingdom. Inside the Palace grounds street sounds are deadened by the high walls that protect the various Royal



buildings and well-manicured tropical gardens. The **Silver Pagoda** in the Royal Palace complex gets its name from 5000 silver tiles covering the floor - each weighing 1kg. Also remarkable: The Emerald Buddha and a Buddha made of solid gold decorated with diamonds.

Right next to the Royal Palace you can not miss the distinctive rust-red **National Museum**. More than 5000 objects are on display here, showing a good overview especially of the Angkorian era.

Tuol Sleng brings back a not too distant unpleasant past:

the terror regime of the Khmer Rouge. The museum was a Khmer Rouge prison and torture chamber. Many of the prisoners interrogated and deprived in Tuol Sleng were later executed on a field (Choeung Ek) 15 km outside Phnom Penh. During the only four years lasting regime of the Khmer Rouge lead by Pol Pot, more than 1 million people ended up on one of the so called **Killing Fields** scattered around the country. Choeung Ek is now a group of mass graves and a memorial stupa containing thousands of skulls.

In the evening take a walk down by the **Tonle Sap River** when all the local Khmers are there praying, dancing, chatting and eating. Being the heart of Cambodias nightlife you could also enjoy a crawl through Phnom Penhs many bars. Night at centrally located (***/****) Hotel, Phnom Penh

Day 3: Phnom Penh - Siem Reap

Breakfast

The trip to Siem Reap can be done either by **plane**, by **car** (road in very good condition) or by **boat** up the Tonle river and lake (not for the fainthearted!).



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In the afternoon, private guided tour to visit **Angkor Thom**, meaning 'Great City'. **Bayon**, built in the exact centre of Angkor Thom reflects the ego of king Jayavarman VII: Enormous stone faces, slightly resembling their creator, are smiling down onto the visitors from as many as 37 towers. **Phimeanakas** (Celestial Palace) though lacking its former splendour, still offers great views of **Baphuon**. This templemountain can be reached via an elevated walkway. Most impressive is its 40 m long Reclining Buddha.

Leper King Terraces consist of a 7 m high platform with deeply carved nagas, demons and other mythological beings. On top there is a replica of a mysterious nude statue - the original resides in the National Museum in Phnom Penh.

Wandering around **Ta Phrom** temple complex, you find yourself in between massive fig and silk cotton trees surrounded by floks of noisy parrots - all of which are contributing to the overall jungle atmosphere.

Angkor Wat is certainly the centrepiece of any visit to the temples of Angkor. Dedicated to the Hindu god Vishnu, this massive temple-mountain was constructed by Suryavarman II at the apex of Khmer political and military dominance in the region. It consists of a massive three-tiered pyramid

crowned by five towers rising 65 meters from ground level. To relax from sightseeing enjoy the sunset from one of Angkor's temple mountains.

Day 4: Jungle and Temples

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Breakfast

Your full day private guided tour first leads you to one of the most mysterious places of Angkor: **Beng Mealea**. This temple, built in the same style as Angkor Wat, is largely overrun by vegetation. Trees growing out



of temple-sites make great photo opportunities and give you a somewhat adventurous feeling when wandering around.

North-east of Angkor **Kbal Spean**, usually referred to as 'The River of Thousand Lingas', is set deep in the jungle. Hundreds of lingas as well as Vishnus, Shivas, Umas and other Hindu deities are carved elaborately in the riverbed. Enjoy a picnic in this beautifully set area before returning to Siem Reap. On the way back, you visit **Banteay Srey**, a Hindu temple dedicated to Shiva. Meaning 'Citadel of the Women' it was probably built by a woman as the stone carvings are very delicate and elaborate.

Night at centrally located (***/****) Hotel, Siem Reap

Day 5: Artists, Silk and Markets

Breakfast

Simply wander around Siam Reap or look for some souvenirs at one of the many **local markets**: From silverware and silk to buddhas or stone carvings you can bargain for almost everything.



In the afternoon, visit **Artisans d'Angkor** to see local artists making wood and stone carvings. Right next to it in **Les Chantiers Ecoles** all stages of the silk making process are displayed: From cultivation of the mulberry trees to dying and weaving. They also sell high-quality souvenirs - by buying them you support a cultural rehabilitation project

Evening: Pick-up from hotel and private transfer to airport **Flight Siem Reap - Phnom Penh**
