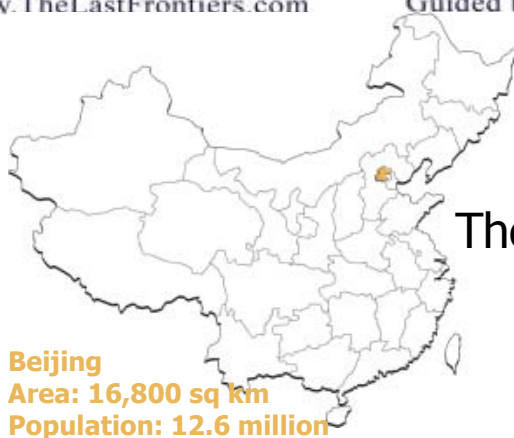

## Beijing Classic: The Centre of the World (4 Days/3 Nights)



**Beijing, political and cultural capital of the Middle Kingdom**, is arguably China's top tourist destination. UNESCO Heritage sites such as Forbidden City, Temple Of Heaven, Summer Palace and of course the Great Wall with hundreds of years of history attract millions of visitors every year. Being venue for the Olympic Games in 2008 Beijing now also experiences a dramatic face-lift. Many City Quarters dating back from the Ming and the Qing dynasties have to make way for ultra-modern high-rise office buildings. But despite all these changes there is still plenty of top visiting sites and rural residential areas to discover. Within relatively short driving distance you can reach the incredible Great Wall - according to Mao Zedong you are not a man (woman?) unless you climbed it. And do not miss to get your picture taken in the Temple of Heaven, which was believed to be the exact geographical **Centre of the World**.

### Day 1: Shanghai to Beijing

#### Flight Shanghai - Beijing

Meet & Greet at Airport  
Private Airport pick-up and hotel check-in

In the afternoon you will discover the traditional **Hutong** residential area around the gorgeous Houhai



Lake on a pedicab ride. The ride will take about 2 hours. On the way, you could stop at the **Bell- and Drum Tower**, Residence of Prince Gong and Shihai Lake. Enjoy a panoramic view of Beijing from the top of the Drum Tower. Every full hour a traditional drum song is played by a band. Later, after your ride, enjoy a drink at one of the many bars and cafes around the **Houhai Lake** area. This place is also great for shopping Tibetan silver jewelry and many other souvenirs.

### Day 2: The Must Sees of Beijing

Breakfast

Your private guided tour will start around 09:00 from your hotel. Main attractions of the **Temple Of Heaven** are the Hall Of Prayer For Good Harvest and the Echo Wall. In the old days the emperors came here twice a year to worship their Gods. Continue to the famous **Tiananmen Square**. Framed by several monumental buildings such as the Great Hall Of The People, The National Museum and the Mao Ze Dong Mausoleum, this



square is the world's largest. From here it is just a short walk to the **Forbidden City**, passing under The Mao Portrait. Many hundreds of years this place used to be the Center of all power in the Middle Kingdom. Besides all the impressive must-visit Halls and marble stairways take your time to discover the picturesque residential buildings and yards lined along the outer walls where once the emperors' relatives and concubines used to live. If you have time enough, take a walk in the nearby **Beihai Park** with its striking White Pagoda or a hike up the top of the hill in **Jingshan Park** to enjoy a stunning view on the Forbidden City. On to The **Summer Palace**, the former get-away of the emperors during Beijing's hot summer months. Fine visiting sites such as the Longevity Hall, the Long Corridor with mythical paintings and the Longevity Hill with a number of smaller temples make this park arguably the most beautiful in Beijing. Other highlights are of course

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the Marble Ship and the 17-Arch Bridge along the Kunming Lake shores.

In the evening take a stroll on **Wangfujing Snack Street** where innumerable food stalls are lined up offering a great variety of cheap food. The brave of you might want to try scorpions and cockroaches on a stick - for the faint-hearted there are also traditional Chinese dishes.

## Day 3: The Great Wall

Breakfast

Away from the tourist mainstream spots like Badaling we arrange a very special Great Wall experience: A hike ON the Great Wall of China from Jinshanling to Simatai! The ride from Beijing to the Great Wall takes about 2 hours per way. Enjoy a short rest at the Miyun Reservoir viewing point. Your 10 kilometer hike on the Great Wall will start off in **Jinshanling** and will take about 4 hours.



On a clear day you will be rewarded with breathtaking views. Especially the last steep hike in **Simatai** starting from a small suspension bridge overlooking a picturesque small reservoir is all worth the hiking effort. Numbers of watch towers are put on the mountain cliffs which makes it a great adventure. Besides, you will not run out of refreshing drinks as they will be sold almost all the way. In Simatai your driver will already await you to take you back to Beijing.

Tired from all this sightseeing? And hungry? For the evening we recommend a visit of a traditional **Beijing Opera** or Beijing Roast Duck dinner at Da Dong Restaurant.

Alternatively, for the less well heeled, we can also arrange a trip to The Great wall at MutianYu or Badaling, if need be.

## Day 4: Beijing to Shanghai

Breakfast

Free. Today will be your last chance for shopping or any other activity. Should you decide on shopping we would recommend the famous Silk Market close to the Friendship Store, the Expat-favoured Yashow Market which locates not far away from the Sanlitun Bar Street or the Panjayuan Antique Market in the southeast of Beijing which is especially popular during the weekend.

## Extension Day: Fragrant Hills, Azure Clouds Temple, Temple Of Reclining Buddha

Breakfast

For today's full-day tour your guide will pick you up 09:00 am at your hotel. The **Fragrant Hills** Park locates northwest of Beijing not far away from the Summer



Palace. You can reach the top of Incense-Burner Peak either by a winding-road hike or by a effortless chairlift which often is crowded though. Depending on weather conditions you will have an amazing view on the countryside. By a walk you will reach **Azure Clouds Temple** with its striking Diamond Throne Pagoda surrounded by a number of stupas. The hall of Arhats contains of about 500 buddhistic statues. It is a short ride to today's last visiting point, the **Temple Of Reclining Buddha**. The temple is one of the oldest in Beijing and was ruined and rebuilt several times. Set in a beautiful garden-like area its main attraction is a giant bronze Buddha which is completed by a number of smaller Buddhas and a drum and a bell tower. In the late afternoon return transfer to your hotel.

## Extension Day: Lama Temple

Breakfast

Pick-up by your private guide at your hotel 09:00 am. Transfer to the Lama Temple locating northeast of the city center. Before converting into a **Tibetan lamasery** this complex used to be the residence of count Yin Zhen who later became emperor Yong Zheng. The main feature is a giant wooden Buddha. Built out of one piece of sandal wood this incredible statue stands 18 meters tall. Right next to the main building you will find an interesting exhibition hall with worship items brought from Tibet. Transfer to your hotel. If you like to see more of Beijing's many historical treasures we suggest a visit to the less known **Zhihua Temple** where - with a little bit of luck - you will witness an unique palace music rehearsal by monks

## Visas:

## Payment:

Invoices payable prior to departure or latest 2 weeks after Invoice Date. China Trips payable to our accounts in China or Cash RMB. Credit Cards and Chinese Bank Cards welcome (conditions apply). International trips payable in US\$ or Euro to our accounts in Hongkong, Singapore or (by exception) in Germany. Cheques accepted (Euro/US\$ 30 surcharge applies).

## Cancellation:

**Cancellation fees apply, if you change or cancel the trip (or parts of the trip) after your verbal or written confirmation.** We will attempt to reduce cancellation fees to a minimum and will calculate cancellation fees according to our actually incurred costs and time spent on your case. **In any case, a minimum of 10% of the total cost of the trip will be invoiced as Cancellation Fee.** Normally, cancellation fees will not be higher than 50% of the confirmed price. The closer a cancellation is to departure, the more expensive it gets. In extreme cases, such as bookings of special packages or cancellations less than 24hrs prior to departure, we will not be able to refund at all.
